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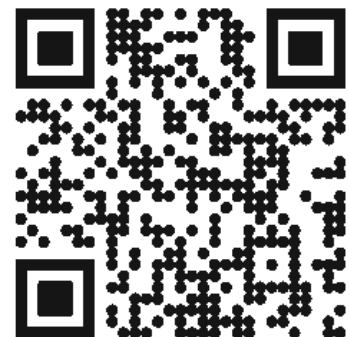
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What Is Liberation Road?

Adelante is a publication of Liberation Road, a nationwide revolutionary political organization working to achieve a socialist United States. We are multinational, multiracial, and multigenerational, organizing around issues that affect the lives of working and oppressed people.

One of our principal goals is to build unity among like-minded socialist organizations and individuals so that we can more effectively face the current challenge from the racist right-wing and neo-fascist social movement led by Donald Trump. We need strong unity as we work for governing power in a Third Reconstruction that will open a path to a fundamental transformation of our society.

Unfortunately, our Block, Broaden, and Build campaign was not strong enough to prevent Trump's narrow victory. We did build our core and made broad allies, but not enough to win. Kamala Harris did reasonably well, given the short campaign. But she could have done better on Gaza and deportations.

We live in a country where economic and political control of our lives resides with a capitalist ruling class headed by a small handful of multi-billionaires, nearly all of whom are white men. This tiny cabal has massive influence over who gets elected to office, who gets to vote, whether women have control over their own bodies, whether people of color can be massively incarcerated or even gunned down with impunity by the police, and whether U.S. workers will have the power to use the tremendous wealth they have created in the democratic interest of all.

Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. correctly characterized U.S. capitalist society in his 1968 speech at Riverside Church as the "greatest purveyor of violence in the world today." Even now, the United States has over 1,000 military bases abroad, causing violence, death, and destruction in the Middle East and Africa while supporting Israel's genocidal war against Palestinians in Gaza.

The U.S. ruling elite continues to expand the trillion-dollar military budget. This ongoing waste occurs even as millions of our people go hungry, lack housing, and suffer from poor schools and hospitals. All these and other necessary social services remain horrendously underfunded while our economy maintains an addiction to fossil fuels, threatening the existence of all life on our planet.

Liberation Road firmly believes that none of this is inevitable or without an alternative. We are working to achieve a socialist society — one based on three basic principles: genuine democracy; true equality for all races and nationalities, genders, and abilities; and an economy based on people's needs, not profit, with control of that economy in the hands of working people and their allies. We believe that to achieve socialism, we must build the broadest possible unity, which must also be internationalist and support all peoples and nations who desire genuine independence and sovereignty.

We must center the fight against racism and national oppression as the best path to unite our multiracial working class and to develop the one alliance that can defeat our capitalist oppressors — that of the working-class movement and the liberation movements of oppressed

people of color. That is why Liberation Road stands in solidarity with the newly elected government in Mexico. It's why we initiated the Mexico Solidarity Project (MSP) to build unity between the vibrant social movements in Mexico and our struggles here in the U.S. Mexico and the U.S. share a nearly 2,000-mile border. We also share a tortured history dating back to the 1840s when the U.S. annexed roughly half of Mexico's territory and began the systematic oppression of its conquered Indigenous and Mexican residents.

Over the past 150+ years, the U.S. has continued to plunder Mexico's resources and superexploit its labor in Mexico itself and in the sweatshops of our nation. Mexico is now in an exciting period with a newly elected female president, Claudia Sheinbaum. She heads the Morena Party, which former president Andrés Manuel López Obrador founded. Morena is working for what they call "the Fourth Transformation," a comprehensive social and economic change project. We believe that if we can defeat the GOP's anti-immigrant and deportation plans, we will help to build strong ties across our borders, provide critical support for the Mexican people, and gain an essential ally in our effort to transform our society.

Towards that end, we must say: ¡Sí se puede!

Immigrant Defense is the Frontline of the Fight for Democracy

The fascist tide in the U.S. has become a tsunami. On August 12, 2025, President Donald Trump sent the National Guard into Washington, DC, the nation's capital, under the usual racist pretext of "law and order." He had previously sent the U.S. military into Los Angeles to support his horrendous ethnic cleansing campaign, aimed at forcibly deporting millions of undocumented immigrants. Still, Trump's raids also detained many legal immigrants and even U.S. citizens who happened to be present. ICE, short for Immigration and Customs Enforcement, has been raiding workplaces, courthouses, parks, and public schools across the country, and detaining thousands of people.

A U.S. federal appeals court ruled on July 11, 2025, that ICE had to stop conducting its indiscriminate raids, which were based on racial profiling. The MAGA administration had the nerve to assert that people with Brown skin who might speak with an accent gave them legal cause to assume they are undocumented immigrants. In recent weeks, ICE has resumed its raids in Los Angeles, defying a court order. It seemed a test by the administration as to whether the courts can restrain their unconstitutional and

undemocratic actions. And indeed, on September 8, 2025, the U.S. Supreme Court, using its shadow docket, sided with the administration and effectively allowed ICE to continue racial profiling, signaling its willingness to legitimize unconstitutional attacks on immigrant communities.

Trump has also issued an executive order that would overturn the constitutional right to birthright citizenship – a right that grants U.S. citizenship to anyone born to immigrants in this country, and a right that U.S. courts have consistently upheld. The administration has also revoked temporary protected status, or TPS, for hundreds of thousands of Haitians, Venezuelans, and other

refugees fleeing violence or natural disaster. These refugees are now subject to deportation, for many, back to a homeland convulsed with chaos and violence.

Clearly, Trump and MAGA, as they promised in Project 2025, are setting out to destroy any vestiges of democracy that can potentially challenge their broader objective of establishing white minority rule. The goal is an apartheid Christian nationalist ethnostate that will allow the billionaire class to openly rule the U.S. as befits their interests of never-ending profits.

To carry out his effort to destroy the remaining shreds of U.S. democracy, Trump has:

- Promised to send the National Guard into other cities with large Black and Brown populations and where Democrats are the governing majority – Chicago, San Francisco, New York, Baltimore, and other urban centers.
- Compelled the Republican-controlled Congress to pass a bill that allocates more than \$150 billion to the Border Patrol and ICE, now the largest domestic military force in the country. This was accompanied by new tax breaks for billionaires and drastic cuts in funding for Medicaid, public education, and environmental and climate protections.
- Begun to establish a network of concentration camps throughout the U.S. to house immigrants and potentially any opponents of the Trump regime.
- Ordered Texas Governor Greg Abbott to gerrymander Congressional districts with large numbers of Black and Latino voters. The immediate aim is to create five new Republican seats. Trump and MAGA rightfully fear that the Republicans will lose their majority in Congress and possibly even the Senate in the 2026 midterm elections. They want to stack the decks against this potential outcome. And just in case, they are “cleansing” voter rolls in several states to eliminate millions of potentially Democratic voters.

- Fired or pushed out hundreds of thousands of federal employees, and voided the union contract with several federal employee unions representing four out of five federal workers. Federal jobs have been a major area of employment for Black and Latino communities. Trump and MAGA also fear that federal workers could resist (in very creative on-the-job ways) the dismantling of environmental and climate regulation, workers’ rights, consumer protections, etc. The attack on federal workers is the new PATCO – the beginning of an all-out effort to destroy U.S. unions.

The storm troopers are in our streets – What can we do?

ICE and the Border Patrol are the MAGA storm troopers, playing the same role that the Nazi SS did for Hitler: to terrorize a vulnerable minority and their communities, and then crush all opposition by force or the threat of force. With GOP majorities, Trump and MAGA have a compliant Congress and Senate, and a stacked U.S. Supreme Court. The Roberts Court has already ruled, on very thin grounds, that U.S. presidents have total executive authority to pretty much do whatever they want.

Clearly, we are on the road to fascism, folks. We can give it other names, such as authoritarianism or despotism, but finally, it means the destruction of democracy wrapped in a brutal racist cloak.

Let's also be clear that Trump and MAGA are not invincible. We can defeat the MAGA Neo-Confederates if we block their assaults, broaden the pro-democracy anti-fascist united front, and build a more substantive and equitable democracy that embodies the concept of "people before profits."

BLOCK: Donald Trump launched his ethnic cleansing campaign in California, mainly in Los Angeles which has the largest immigrant community in the country. Masked and heavily armed ICE agents, accompanied by armored vehicles and helicopters, stormed into agricultural fields, workplaces, schools, parks, and even courthouses where immigrants were seeking to secure legal documentation. ICE agents even assaulted U.S. Senator Alex Padilla when he attempted to ask questions of a government official about the raids, and followed up that attack by assaulting labor leader David Huerta, president of the Service Employees International Union-United Service Workers West (SEIU-USWW).

Resistance to these tactics was immediate, broad, and militant. California Governor Gavin Newsom opposed the sending in of the National Guard and took Trump to court to stop this move. Citywide immigrant defense networks were established which warned people of ICE raids, provided legal support and mutual aid, and effectively utilized social media and even the mainstream media to let LA residents know what terror was being carried out in their city, which is a sanctuary city.

These networks included labor unions, worker centers, immigrant support organizations, faith organizations, and others. Los Angeles Mayor Karen Bass, the Los Angeles City Council, and the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors condemned the raids and stood up for the rights of immigrants. In fact, when ICE agents attempted to enter two Los Angeles public schools, they were stopped by the schools' principals and teachers.

Faced with this resistance, Trump sent 700 U.S. Marines and 4,000 National Guard troops into the city in a clear effort to crush this resistance. Well, you know what? They failed! Trump was forced to remove his storm troopers from the city, the last of them leaving on July 31, 2025.

What does the experience of Los Angeles tell us?

- Resistance is never futile. People from nearly every LA community – from the barrios to the suburbs – stood up to ICE and MAGA. It was a true multi-racial resistance led by those communities most affected by the ICE raids.
- A broad united front is the key to victory. The united front in LA included Black, Brown, and Asian Pacific Islander activists and leaders; a strong network of immigrant rights organizations; Black, Brown, and API worker centers; broad sectors of the faith community; legal and civil rights organizations; artists, musicians, and other cultural workers; senior organizations; pro-Palestine organizations; socialist organizations; the Democratic governor; the state's Democratic U.S. senators and Congressional representatives; and LA's Democratic mayor, city council, school board, and county board of supervisors. It was this broad united front that forced the Trump administration to withdraw its military forces. This is an essential lesson for every community where the administration sends in the troops or threatens to do so. Of course, ICE is still doing its dirty work in LA, so the struggle continues. However, the city has learned that a unified and militant resistance movement can effectively counter MAGA.

BROADEN: ICE continues to terrorize communities in LA and throughout the U.S. And everywhere it operates, a dynamic resistance movement has arisen. The task of the U.S. left and progressive movement is to support these movements, to help them connect into a coherent national force, and to help develop a strategy that can guide the multiple creative tactics that have emerged from among the masses, a plan whose goal is to build up a unified and militant resistance, and which weakens the forces of the Neo-Confederate/MAGA forces. To accomplish this task, we will need to be unafraid to work with a broad and diverse array of forces, including many leaders of the Democratic Party, top union officials, leaders of mainstream nonprofits, entertainment figures, and others whom we might not usually consider our allies. This idea is anathema to some on the left who would rather drink turpentine than work with, say, U.S. Senator Chuck Schumer. I would argue that in order to defeat the fascist threat, we need all of the allies we can get.

Let's keep in mind the enemy we are up against: a right-wing social movement supported by a significant sector of the billionaire ruling class, a social movement that now controls the White House and the U.S. Congress, as well as having a Supreme Court majority and a significant number of pro-MAGA federal judges. It has massive media support from *Fox News* and a diverse array of social media platforms. It has political dominance in 28 states. The enemy is also fed by well-funded think tanks such as the ones that developed Project 2025, a large social base among white evangelical churches, neo-Nazi organizations, and a growing array of well-armed militias.

We will not defeat these forces without a united front that has the necessary resources, a coherent strategy, effective leadership, and a diverse and broad range of allies. We need a united front that can work effectively at all levels of struggle: policy, electoral, litigation, mass action, peaceful civil disobedience, communications, media, and work on the art and cultural front.

As the experience of California shows, MAGA can be defeated if there is a strong leadership core and a broad front. But ICE is still conducting raids throughout California, sending masked thugs into workplaces and other areas where immigrants gather. The fight continues, and even in California, we cannot achieve complete victory – kicking out the ICE thugs – unless the united front is even broader, and with a clearly defined longer-term strategy.

BUILD: While defeating the MAGA fascists must be our absolute number one priority, the U.S. left should work

together on this project AND work to advance a project for a more democratic, equitable, just, and non-imperialist U.S. society. While a return to the “status quo” before Trump would be a huge victory for working and oppressed people in the U.S. (e.g., winning the reproductive protections provided by *Roe v. Wade*), we should be working towards a much better society than that. This could include:

- Passing the John Lewis Voting Rights law, which would protect and vastly expand voting rights for working people.
- Passing comprehensive reproductive justice legislation that completely protects the right to abortion.
- Passing the PRO Act, to facilitate unionization throughout all U.S. industries. This would be a huge economic and social benefit for tens of millions of U.S. workers, most especially workers of color and women.
- Restoring the Department of Education, to reinstitute federal oversight of public schools, reverse privatization efforts, expand funding for K–12 and higher education,

ensure robust programs for English language learners, and provide student debt relief.

- Creating strong legal rights and protections for trans people and the LGBTQ+ community.
- Restoring the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau, to protect working people from predatory lending, abusive debt collection, discriminatory financial practices, and corporate fraud.
- Abolishing ICE and creating an immigration system that facilitates the processing of asylum and refugee applications, and creating a path to citizenship for undocumented immigrants currently residing in the U.S.
- Grant immediate citizenship to all DACA recipients.
- Create a truly progressive federal tax system that makes the top 1% pay their fair share of taxes.
- Cut the military budget by 75%, close overseas military bases, and devote those resources to a comprehensive jobs program to build affordable housing, schools, health centers, and hospitals; to clean up the environment; and to build clean energy projects as part of a just transition from the fossil fuel economy.

These are just examples of the type of democratic and equitable society that we can and should create. But we can only do this if we work together. The billionaires will never give up their power without – as Frederick Douglass reminded us – a demand, an organized multiracial, worker-led movement that seeks to build a truly inclusive society that honors the history and contributions of the Indigenous peoples first of all, but also of the African American, Latino, and Asian Pacific Islander communities that have done so much to build the economic and social structures of our society. As the saying goes, “If we can dream it, we can make it happen.” That is the vision that should guide us as we work together to defend our immigrant sisters and brothers, to safeguard and enhance our democracy, and to defeat the fascist tide that would enslave us all.

A Program for Resistance

We must build local, state, and national opposition to Trump’s ethnic cleansing program. Our campaign should take leadership from the Chicano-Latino and other communities that will be most directly impacted, but should aim to build a broad popular front of unions, worker centers, civic organizations, grassroots organizations, civil liberties groups, art and cultural activists, academics, and elected officials. Our strategy should include grassroots organizing, voter registration and mobilization, creative use of all forms of social media, and non-violent self-defense plans to keep ICE out of our schools, workplaces, places of worship, etc.

Internationalism must be central to our strategy. We must support and expand the ongoing efforts to build solidarity with the social movements in Mexico and encourage them to pressure the Mexican government to refuse to cooperate with any ethnic cleansing campaign initiated by a Trump administration. There is already precedent for a stance like this from Mexico’s president, who has refused to accept immigrants that the government of Texas is attempting to deport to Mexico. The Mexican government can also be encouraged to suggest a similar position with the governments in Guatemala, El Salvador, Honduras, and with other “pink tide” governments in America Latina, as well as with China. The growing attack on Chinese immigrants to the U.S. should be considered an important element of the militaristic efforts by the U.S. ruling elite to make China “enemy number one” of the United States.

Workers (of the world) unite! Ethnic cleansing is a workers’ issue. The labor movement can, indeed it must, play an active and aggressive role in the immigration fight. Not only do unions have large numbers of Latin@ members, but strengthening workers’ rights at home and abroad stops the global race to the bottom. In 2000, the AFL-CIO reversed a hundred years of anti-immigrant activity, and since then has played a more progressive role. Leftists in the labor movement need to understand that labor’s future will largely be determined by our approach to white supremacy, and today that requires practical and political responses to the immigration crisis like those mentioned above.

Build Black-Brown unity. Separating families has consistently been white supremacist U.S. policy, with respect to Native Americans (forcible removal of children to schools designed to “knock the Indian out of them”),

African Americans (selling husband, wives, and children separately), Asians (separating Japanese American fathers suspected of being community leaders from their families, by putting them into different internment camps during WWII), and Latin@s as we are now witnessing in horror.

Together, the Black and Brown populations in the U.S. represent more than 80 million people in areas of historic concentration in the U.S. South and the U.S. Southwest. A “Sunbelt Strategy” that unites our two social movements could anchor a united front of all oppressed people of color and a significant minority of white working people. A common campaign against the mass incarceration of Black people and the ethnic cleansing of Latin@s could be a major launching point for melding these forces into the foundation, the beating heart, of the united front that can lead the working class out of capitalist barbarism.

Build unity on the Left. Left and socialist organizations should be finding more ways to unite against the Trump ethnic cleansing anti-immigrant campaign. This is at once a working class, women’s, and oppressed peoples’ issue. The moral outrage and the political strategy behind this campaign should motivate left organizations to meet, to talk, to strategize, and to collaboratively support the growing and massive resistance movement that has developed around these issues. In many communities the Sanctuary movement unites a broad range of people in the

name of protecting their neighbors and friends. This takes many forms, from campaigns to pass Sanctuary legislation to civil disobedience at ICE facilities to disruption of raids and establishment of literal sanctuary churches and homes where people at risk of detention or deportation can be protected. This could be an important first step towards building the broader Left unity we need to truly transform this country and achieve socialism.

Build – Block – Broaden: We need a united front NOW against the extremist Neo-Confederate Right, which is constructing a dangerous path to fascism. They are eliminating the right to vote for tens of millions of people of color; demonizing the media; putting forward falsehoods; praising dictators; gutting trade union rights, women’s rights, and civil rights; and mobilizing an openly racist, white nationalist, neo-Nazi social base, all aimed towards creating an apartheid country. Time is of the essence. We must unite all who can be united in a broad united front that even includes neoliberal Democrats to confront this common enemy and build a new majority committed to justice and self-determination.

Our immediate demands

An immediate end to the policy of arresting and criminalizing asylum applicants and incarcerating their children. While the government should pay the cost for reuniting children with their families, the actual work of and resources for

doing so should be done by respected immigrants' rights organizations, the faith community, and community-based organizations.

Immediate and unconditional residency for all DREAMERS, and a simple path to citizenship. These young people were brought to the U.S. as children and are undocumented; they have spent most of their lives here, and do not remember or identify with their country of origin.

Grant immediate asylum to all migrants and allow them to stay with family members or friends in the U.S. and to work with complete protection of labor laws and rights.

Grant legal residency to the undocumented spouses of "legalized" residents or U.S. citizens, a policy authorized by the Biden Administration but blocked by a racist court decision.

Add 500 new judges who can process and approve asylum claims, ending the terrible backlog that keeps migrants and their families in a fearful limbo. There should be no further expansion of the Border Patrol, already the largest federal police force.

Our longer-term demands

Abolish ICE. It is the modern-day Gestapo and should be immediately closed down. The resources now committed to ICE and the Border Patrol should be directed instead to immediately processing all asylum applications, the reunification of separated families, and speeding up



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decisions on hundreds of thousands of other legalization applications.

Just and democratic immigration policies. Immigrants usually leave home due to U.S. military, economic, and political policies; we on the Left say they should therefore be granted full legal, civil, and labor rights. But beyond the political rationale, just immigration policies are based on the moral sentiment engraved on the Statue of Liberty: to give refuge and freedom to those suffering from want. Our policies now do not welcome — they punish: they cause immigrants to die near the border, to be deported, to face violence and death from which they are fleeing, to live in constant fear of deportation, to survive in the shadows of the society they desperately seek to join.

The U.S. must reduce and retrain the Border Patrol in humanitarian practice, stop migra raids in our communities, and get the U.S. military off the U.S.-Mexico border. We have resources, we have room, we have compassion based on our own immigrant histories: we demand that the U.S. grant immediate and unconditional residency for all undocumented immigrants. If there is free flow of capital across borders, there should also be free flow of labor.

Hands off Mexico. Trump and company have threatened a military invasion of Mexico! U.S. bilateral relations with Mexico must be based on respect for Mexico's sovereignty, genuine mutual trade reciprocity, and an end to the War on Drugs which has contributed significantly to the rise of the narcocartels in Mexico. We must also oppose all U.S. efforts to politically, economically, or militarily pressure the new Morena government to disrupt AMLO's agenda for greater social and economic equity.

End the embargo on Cuba and the economic sanctions on Venezuela and Nicaragua. Most current migrants are from those three countries due to the severe situation imposed on them by U.S. policies.

For the love of peace and human dignity

The ultimate goal of Trump and his Neo-Confederate supporters is to institutionalize an apartheid system in the United States. We already have a highly racially oppressive and unequal society. But we do not have apartheid, a racially based system where a white minority exercises political, economic, and cultural dominance over a non-white majority population. We will inevitably become a

majority people of color nation, and that's when apartheid could be fully institutionalized.

The white supremacists in power are preparing for that day. Maintaining supremacy will require a massive repressive apparatus and that is being put in place; the agenda of the Right is to defund social programs while increasing expenditures on policing and the military. It also requires the dismantling of democratic processes. The attacks on voting and other civil rights specifically targeting people of color are laying down more prerequisites to apartheid.

The dehumanization and demonization of people of color is another important ingredient, and hatred and fear are powerful weapons in the arsenal of the racist Right. The carrot element of the carrot-and-stick strategy to pacify people of color has been abandoned, as is painfully evident with the Trump/Right ethnic cleansing campaign. The radical Right is ascendant, and now we are getting the stick: they mean us serious harm.

But as people of color become a majority, we are going to be a very angry majority. A majority situated strategically economically and politically. A majority with immense potential networks in the global South. A majority with vast experience of struggle in virtually all arenas. And a majority that has support from tens of millions of white workers.

Unless the ruling class completely abandons all pretense of democratic governance, for example outlawing elections, the electoral arena will become an even more highly contested arena of struggle. Our populations are younger than the white population, and increasingly large sections of our population can vote. We are situated in crucial areas of the South and Southwest, as well as other areas. The Asian Pacific Islander populations are the fastest growing of all, with significant concentrations in the Southwest and South.

We are undoubtedly a threat. The choice between barbarism and socialism is clearer than ever, as barbarism is the order of the day particularly for Blacks and Browns. For all who love peace and believe in human dignity, the time is now.
